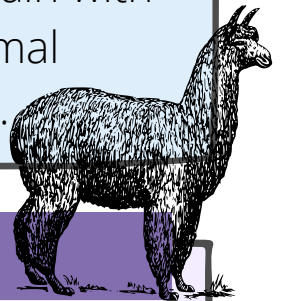
WHAT DO THEY EAT?

- Llamas need very little water.

HEAVY LOAD

- They can walk 20 miles a day carrying heavy loads.
- If a load is TOO heavy, the llama will sit down and not move.
- The need for little water and move through rocky terrain with ease makes this animal durable and dependable.

- A llama is a South American relative of the camel, though the llama does not have a hump.
- The Alpaca is a cousin to the llama.



FUN FACTS

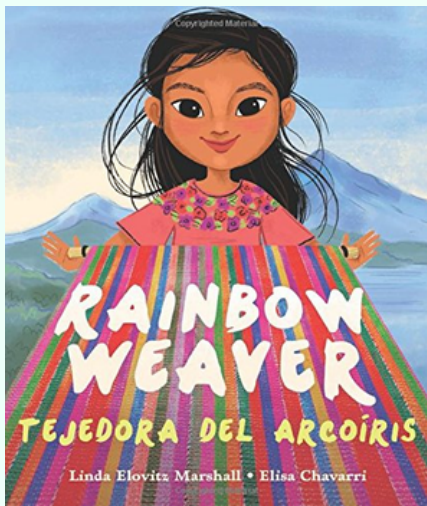
- Llamas can run very fast.

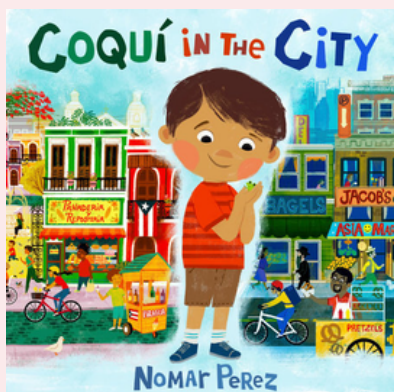
